NTCC Honors' films have provided a windfall of merits for student resumes as well as the first cinematic portrayals of events of regional significance. Harriet Potter Ames, "the bravest woman of the Texas Revolution," has inspired a great book by Elithe Kirkland, and also a monument by Caddo lake, but never a film. NE Texas has also lacked a fundamental link with its history before 1800 without a museum to explore the intricacies of the Caddoan cultures. This gracious gift also aids work by Honors students to promote the museum's prospects.




# Honors Alumni: Where are they now?

# **Fall Happenings**




