NCHC select committees proposals to present on the basis of appeal, previous awards, and scholarly promise. Making the cut this year for NTCC were Elyse Coleman, for her work on railroads, Kayleah Cumpian on Wright Patman, Ana Martínez early Tejanos, Miranda Mendoza on Gematria, and Tyler Reynolds, who introduced the Honors film on Wright Patman.

Elyse Coleman's Caldwell-Prize winning work conveys the excitement that greeted the train technology in the 19th century. Our automobile-culture has a more jaded version of the story.

Kayleah Cumpian's Boe-Award work showed how a Northeast Texas Congressman (1929-1976), conveyed populist momentum in Northeast Texas and Texas at large.

Miranda Mendoza's look at symbolic numbers reticulated the interdisciplinary core of Honors. Mendoza linked progress to the spiritualization of mathematics.

Ana Martínez presented her revisionist work on Hispanics who resisted the exclusionary culture of post-Revolution Texas.

Tyler Reynolds chaired our second panel in two years at the NCHC featuring our films. Reynolds was our 2013-14 producer.

Coming Film of Harriet Potter Ames



The life of Harriet Potter has become an acclaimed legend of NE Texas. Charles Dickens related the tragedy of her 2nd husband in *American Notes*. In 1959, her story morphed into an international best-seller by Elithe Kirkland--*Love is a Wild Assault*. For the 1st first time, thanks to ongoing (!) film donations of **Jerald and Mary Lou Mowery**, Honors NE has made a cinematic version of the tale. Starring Cassia Rose, and Tyler Reynolds (above), and produced by William Villalobos, the film will première at the Mount Pleasant Library, 20 February, at 7 PM.

NTCC continues to flourish with a strong and positive tie between two spirited societies, Alpha Mu Chi (AMC)--our local PTK chapter, and Honors. PTK is the largest honorary society in the United States, with five times more chapters than its university equivalent—Phi Beta Kappa. It has a growing international presence, and gives away millions of dollars in scholarships each year. Our Honors Students had been averaging about one of these national scholarship awards a year, but in the last year we have won six (p. 3 and volume 7:1 of *Alacrity*), plus 3 state PTK awards.

A photo of a recent AMC meeting shows a group comprised half of honors and ex-honors students, and half of non-honors students. AMC has been amazingly successful in recent years, guided by **Dr. Melissa Weinbrenner** who again has been elected a PTK Scholar, and is NTCC's 2015 Piper nominee. AMC has won 2 International-level *Honors in Action* awards in two years, a very rare feat! **Elyse Coleman**, (pp. 1-2) was the lead writer for the 2015 award.
