2014 was the best finish ever for our Presidential Scholar sophomores, and the most exceptional "higher-echelon" outcome ever for the college. Is it possible that no college in Texas has ever matched it? Such a finale was another testament to the synergy between all the elements of our honors community. This includes our amazing friends from the community! Guistwhite Award is perhaps the most notable sophomore award: only 20 are given, and this year, there were 1,700 applications nationally.

NTCC was the only college in the nation to win 2.

NTCC has also won more Guistwhites than any other college in the nation, including runner-up, giant Mesa (40k students) of Arizona since 2012. Our recipients this year were Noah Griffin, and Michael Jordan.

This year there were 3,705 applications for the Jack Kent Cooke (JKC) award. NTCC won 2 of 85. We congratulate Matthew Jordan, and Stephen Milburn.

On the All-USA Team, we had Noah Griffin in the top 20. Collin College (51k) won 2, to 1 for us. But giant Collin won only 1 Guistwhite, and no JKCs.

NTCC Honors has also now won more regional Boe Awards than any college or university (7).

Firsts for the College



Noah Griffin, son of Dr. Steven and Joy, from Pittsburg, 1st of NTCC to make the All-USA Team, and the Leader of Promise Award of Phi Theta Kappa (PTK). He was featured in *USA Today* on 8 April 2014. He starred as Wright Patman in an effort that gave NTCC its 1st Webb Chapter Award.



Matthew Jordan, son of the late Timothy, and Sandra, first to win triple crown: the Jack Kent Cooke, Cola-Cola Gold, and the Guistwhite. He was our 1st to sit on the Board of the Great Plains Honors Council, defeating a university student. He led our 1st group Caldwell Award.





Ricky Huitema (left) was 1st to place in 4 Poster-Poetry Contests, and our 1st Terry Award Scholar. **Stephen Milburn** was 1st to win Chitsey, and Star Awards. For the 1st time, NTCC won two JKCs.
