Pilgrims in Mount Pleasant

The establishment of Pilgrim's Pride & its chickenprocessing plant in Mount Pleasant was in 1960. It expanded into Mexico in 1987. This led to a migration of Hispanics to Mount Pleasant in and after 1988 due to Pilgrim's capability to provide stable jobs and standard living conditions. This led to a Hispanic-based society with 55.5% of the population in Mount Pleasant today.



It created a base for many Hispanics.


Thesis: Pilgrim's did not create a jungle effect.


