

My approach is consensual in an age where Americans are polarized. Both sides disavow Hitler. Their fundamental consensus is in disclaiming him. Thus, we have a starting point for a new way to evaluate American politics. We carefully compare a candidate with Hitler. The most consensual, apt, pro-American candidates will have the lowest scores on the Hitler Rubric.
