Northeast Texas Community College respectfully supports the \$2.03 billion formula funding request submitted by the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC) in its letter to the Legislative Budget Board and the Governor's Office, Budget Division. State support remains critical to the district as it continues to fulfil its statutory role and mission to offer vocational, technical, and academic courses for certificate, transfer, and degree programs. Together with Texas' other 49 community college districts, we will continue do much of the heavy lifting in the state's efforts to achieve the Building a Talent Strong Texas strategic plan. Expanded state investments in community colleges will support dual credit courses that give high school students an early start in postsecondary education; initiatives to recruit uncredentialed Texans and support them through graduation; and the creation and expansion of programs built on the skills necessary for gainful employment and Texas' continued economic growth.

With continued support from the state of Texas, Northeast Texas community College will:

- Increase short-term, micro-credential programs, such as cyber-security, logistics, truck driving and other high demand job training programs beneficial to the economic growth of the region.
- Continue to expand our award-winning CTE/Dual Credit center in Mt Pleasant to support regional workforce programs vital to our local economy.
- Increase the number of high-demand health science dual credit programs to include more of our rural area ISD's.
- Fund additional student support personnel and career counseling staff in support of the Texas "Guided Pathways" project to improve high school-to-community college and four-year college transfer and completion rates.
- Further expand our innovative work scholarship program, which provides students with meaningful work at above-market wages, and allows them to complete a community college degree without student loan debt. This program is uniquely designed to address the cost of attendance while also preparing "work-ready" students who will have a valuable work history to add to their educational credentials upon graduation.
- Continue support for an Early College High School in collaboration with an area ISD to provide additional dual credit opportunities for low income/first generation students.
- Provide reskilling/training opportunities for displaced workers affected by the recent pandemic.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN POLICY:

There are no significant changes in policy which impact this budget.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN PROVISION OF SERVICE:

There are no significant changes in provision of service which impact this budget.

SIGNIFICANT EXTERNALITIES:

The Covid-19 pandemic and growing inflation has had a dramatic and adverse impact on NTCC's ongoing operations, our students, and the community we serve. The federal aid NTCC received in the form of HEERF funding has been very helpful in providing direct support for selected students and direct Pandemic related expenditures, but has not provided sufficient support to cover the large amount of institutional expenses needed to safely continue college operations in a pandemic environment or sufficiently help with the recovery from inflation related expenditure increases.

Background checks are conducted on all security-sensitive positions as permitted by the Texas Government Code, Sec. 411.094 and Texas Education Code, Section 61.003 (8), and consistent with the college's human resources policies and procedures.

Administrator's Statement

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Northeast Texas Community College's Campus is located approximately six miles southeast of Mt. Pleasant, Titus County, Texas. Classes are offered at alternate sites in Camp, Morris, Franklin, Red River, Titus, Upshur, and Wood Counties. The College provides associate, vocational, and continuing education courses.

ORGANIZATION OF COLLEGE

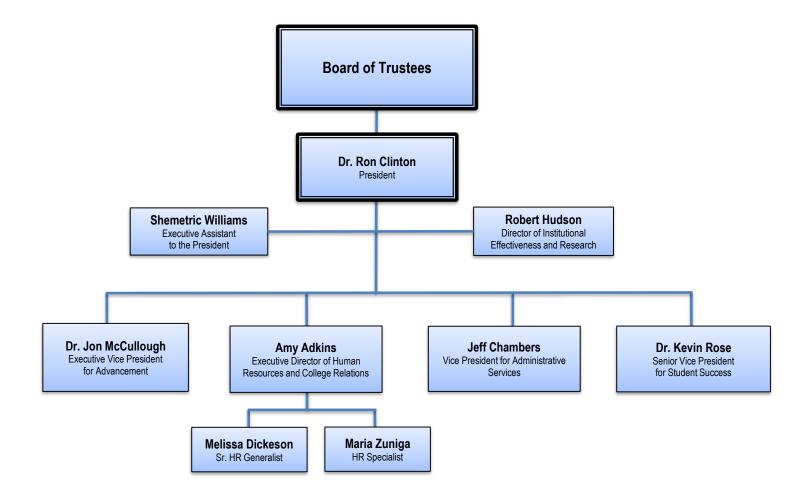
