

CRRSAA – Student Portion Quarterly Report

- 1. **NTCC** acknowledges that the College has signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, the funds received under the CRRSAA (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Students must have filled out a needs assessment survey and,

Student must:

- o Be enrolled or accepted for enrollment in a degree, certificate, or other eligible program
- Have earned a high school diploma or GED
- Maintaining satisfactory academic progress
- o Not owe a refund on grants previously received
- Submit statement of educational purpose
- Submit social security number (school shall verify any social security number provided by a student)

- Be a citizen of US or eligible noncitizen (shall be verified prior to the individual's receipt of a grant)
- Register with Selective Service, if required to do so (confirmation required)
- If convicted of a crime involving fraud in obtaining T4 funds, have completed the repayment of such funds

Student must not:

- Have borrowed in violation of the annual or aggregate loan limits
- Have previously received a baccalaureate or professional degree
- Have been convicted of any offense under any Federal or State law involving the possession or sale of a controlled substance for conduct that occurred during a period of enrollment for which the student was receiving any T4 aid
- 7. Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

Students that received money have been sent a letter in the mail or by email explaining the reason for the payment. Students that received money filled out a needs survey through the Financial Aid Department.
