This syllabus serves as the documentation for all course policies and requirements, assignments, and instructor/student responsibilities.

Information relative to the delivery of the content contained in this syllabus is subject to change. Should that happen, the student will be notified.

Course Description: 3 credit hours.

Lecture/Lab/Clinical: Three hours of class each week.

Introduces and develops foundational skills in applying essential and emerging business productivity information technology tools. The focus of this course is on business productivity software applications, including word processing, spreadsheets, databases, presentation graphics, data analytics, and business-oriented utilization of the internet.

Prerequisite(s): Knowledge of keyboard.

Student Learning Outcomes:

1. Describe the fundamentals of information technology concepts – hardware, software, security, and privacy.
2. Demonstrate proper file management techniques to manipulate electronic files and folders in local, network, and online environments.
3. Create business documents with word processing software using spelling and grammar check, format and layout, tables, citations, graphics, and mail merge.
4. Create business documents and analyze data with spreadsheet software using (1) tables, sorting, filtering, charts and graphics, pivot tables, macros; (2) statistical, financial, logical and look-up functions and formulas; and (3) add-ins.
5. Create business multimedia presentations with presentation software using templates, lists, groups, themes, colors, clip art, pictures, tables, transitions, animation, video, charts, and views.
6. Create databases and manage data with database software using tables, fields, relationships, indexes, keys, views, queries, forms, reports, and import/export functions.
7. Integrate business software applications.
8. Use web-based technologies to conduct ethical business research.
9. Use “goal seeking” and “what-if analysis” to solve problems and make adjustments/recommendations in a business environment.

Evaluation/Grading Policy:

All quizzes/assignments/discussions/exams are completed individually and submitted electronically through Blackboard. Each assignment is worth a set number of points. Grades will be posted within 5 days of the posted due date. Please pay careful attention to the due dates. **Late work will NOT be accepted.**

This course adheres to the NTCC Academic Honesty and Ethics statements discussed below. In addition, if a student submits the work of anyone else, they and the other person (if possible) will earn a zero grade on that assignment. PowerPoint: 3 hands-on assignments (10 points each), 3 chapter reinforcements (5 points each), and 1 individual presentation (55 points total)

Final Grades:

This course is set up on a point scale. You can calculate your grade at any time as all point values are listed on this syllabus. **Your final course grade will be based upon this scale only. There are NO extra credit opportunities. In addition, there are no “retakes” for any assignments or exams.** The scores that you receive on your original submissions will be what is counted toward your final grade. Please understand that I must adhere to this grading policy for all students so exceptions will not be made.

Course Structure and Overview:

All courses require extensive engagement (with other students, the instructor, and the course materials) as well as timely completion of assignments. Items are due weekly, and sometimes each day of the week (see course schedule for specific due dates). Thus, keeping up with the schedule is essential to your success. Your personal schedule must allow you to keep up with the due dates for the readings and other assignments. Late work is not allowed in this course, so you must plan your schedule carefully. As this is a face-to-face course, attendance is expected.

Blackboard will be used for file submission, but you will need to keep a copy of all work in case of error or file corruption.

All hands-on exams require the textbook. This is not a class to fall behind in, please submit work on time. Assignments submitted a second time after they have been graded are *not* accepted – in other words “no redo’s”, even if the second submission is prior to the due date. It is up to the student to verify that the assignment is correctly submitted before it is graded. This also applies to submitting the wrong file. When a wrong file is submitted, the student will earn a zero grade. Checking submitted files is a good habit to form right after file(s) have been uploaded. If the student discovers a wrong file before it is graded, let the instructor know. The instructor will remove the student's previous submission so that it can resubmitted. If a wrong file is discovered after 8 pm on the night it is due, send an email via your NTCC email address with the correct files attached. Please take note that your instructor grades most days of the week. Again, if an assignment is already graded, you CANNOT resubmit it.

This class is using Microsoft Office 365 & 2019 application programs. Do not attempt to complete assignments using an earlier version of these programs, as you will have many difficulties. Also, please do not use a Google Chrome computer for these assignments. Additionally, the required textbook is based on the Windows version of Microsoft Office, so it is recommended that you use a computer with Microsoft Windows. A link to instructions on how to install the required software can be found under the Start Course Here folder in Blackboard.

Communications:

It is required that students re-create each assignment. Significant grade reductions will occur when a student submits a previous semester's work.

Certain portions of this course may be recorded via video conferencing software to assist students in course material review or later viewing by a student who was not able to attend the live session. The recordings will be made available only to students within the course and will cease to be available upon completion of the course. Students may not retain, reproduce, or share recordings.

Blackboard will be used for file submission, but you will need to keep a copy of all work in case of error or file corruption.

Microsoft Office 365 or 2019 software is needed to complete ALL homework assignments. This is free for all full-time NTCC students. A link to instructions on how to install the required software can be found under the Start Course Here folder in Blackboard.

You should check your NTCC email account daily. This email account will be the official form of communication for this course. Your email address is your first initial + your last name + the last three digits of your SSN. If you do not have a social security number, use the last three digits of your birth year. Your password is your birthday in the form of mmddyyyy (Ex: May 8, 1992 would be 05081992). Once you are logged in to the MyEagle portal, you can access your email by clicking on the Gmail icon. A good suggestion is to set up your email on your phone so that you will not miss important messages about the course.

Late Work Policy:

The word “assignments” refers to all work that is submitted via Blackboard or presented in class. Students are to submit assignments on or before the stated due date/time. **Late work is not accepted.**
