COURSE DESCRIPTION

A study of the historical, political, and economic forces that have shaped the cultural identity of Texas from Native American prehistory through the Spanish conquest, republican independence, statehood, confederacy, and reconstruction to a major role in the emergence of the New South and the new economy.

TEXTBOOK

Students need the current edition of <u>Gone to Texas</u>: A <u>History of the Lone Star State</u> (ISBN-13: 978-0190642396). Since the textbook is provided online, it is not necessary to purchase a hard copy. Follow the directions in the Getting Started Folder on Blackboard for instructions for accessing the book.

- 1. To further the student's understanding of the people, ideas, and events that influenced the development of Texas.
- 2. To further the student's understanding of the cultural diversity that shaped the unique history of Texas.
- 3. To foster an appreciation for scholarly research in Texas history.

Chapter Quizzes @ 35%

There will be ten question quiz for each of the eighteen chapters in the book. These quizzes will consist of multiple choice, True/False and Fill in the Blank questions. Quizzes will be averaged equally and count for thirty-five percent of the total course grade. Quizzes should be completed after finishing chapter readings.

Blogs, Discussions and other Assignments @ 35%

There will at least one assignment for every module in addition to the chapter quizzes. These assignments will be averaged equally and count for thirty-five percent of total course grade.

Research Essay @ 30%

Essay topics and due dates will be determined after consulting with the instructor. A brief written summary of the proposed essay topic will be required before essay topics are finalized. Essays should be a minimum of 5 pages in length typed in 12-point TNR font (or equivalent). A cover page with the student's name, instructor's name, course, date, and topic must be included as well as a Works Cited page (neither count as part of the required 5 pages). Essays are required to have in-text citations using either MLA (parenthetical) or Chicago style (footnotes). Essay must be submitted toTurnitin.com to be considered.
